



NCR-SARE promotes sustainable agriculture through competitive grant programs that advance farming systems that are profitable, environmentally sound, and good for communities.

The 12 NCR states—Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, and Wisconsin—

have a rich agricultural history. NCR-SARE's challenge is to preserve its place in the front lines of agricultural production through innovative food and fiber systems that promote healthy communities, a healthy environment, and a healthy economy.

NCR-SARE has awarded more than \$80 million worth of competitive grants to farmers and ranchers, researchers, educators, public and private institutions, nonprofit groups, and others exploring sustainable agriculture in 12 states. GRANTS

NCR-SARE offers grants to farmers, ranchers and ag professionals, and has invested more than \$80 million in projects that improve the sustainability of farming and ranching systems. Grant Programs in the North Central region:

Farmer/Rancher

Supports farmers and ranchers who want to explore sustainable solutions to problems through on-farm research, demonstration, and education projects. Offered as individual, team of two, or group grants. **Call for proposals opens in mid-August, due in early December.**

Research and Education

Supports multi-disciplinary teams of researchers, producers, educators, and others exploring sustainable agriculture. Call for preproposals opens in August, due in October.

Professional Development Program

Supports training agricultural educators in extension, Natural Resources Conservation Service, private, and not-for-profit sectors, using farmers as educators and addressing emerging issues in the farm community. **Call for proposals opens in February, due in early April.**

Graduate Student

Supports projects by graduate students that address sustainable agriculture issues and are part of the student's degree program. Call for proposals opens in February, due in April.

Partnership

Supports cooperation between agriculture professionals and small groups of farmers and ranchers to catalyze on-farm research, demonstration, and education activities related to sustainable agriculture. **Call for proposals opens in early August, due in late October.**

Youth Educator

Supports opportunities for youth educators to research, demonstrate, and learn more about sustainable agriculture. Call for proposals opens in mid-August, due in mid-November.
